Reference Toolkit for Librarians in Developing Countries

To assist librarians and decision makers in developing countries, IFLA has funded a small project to develop a web-based toolkit to bring together existing and freely-available guidelines and other materials that can be utilized to develop reference services. The project is being carried out by Martin Kesselman, Secretary of the IFLA Reference Work Section together with Sarah Watstein at Virginia Commonwealth University. The toolkit will provide an important compilation and will be the groundwork for a larger project that is planned together with the Information Literacy Section and Division VII to build and create training programs for reference and information literacy for librarians.
